Our aim is to offer a safe, welcoming and stimulating home to our Residents.

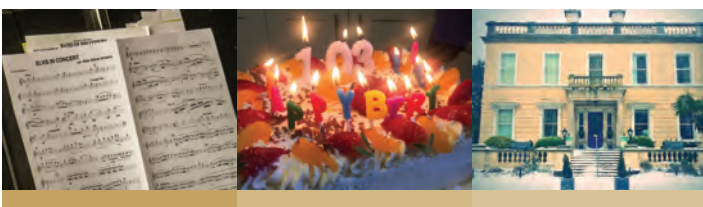
With 140 inpatient beds, the hospital is a public voluntary hospital run by the Leopardstown Park Hospital Board and subject to regulation by HIQA. It provides specialist older persons' services in the areas of rehabilitation, respite, day services and residential care.

The Hospital is entering a new era of development and modernisation with some areas being upgraded and infrastructure being replaced with a new hospital as part of the HSE capital plan.

An Exciting Time to Join the LPH Team

This is an exciting time in the Hospital's proud and long history. Significant investment is being made to redevelop some of our existing buildings and at the same time we are moving through the design and planning phases prior to construction commencing for our new-build project consisting of 125 single ensuite rooms.

- Support staff will enable their front-line colleagues to deliver the best possible care

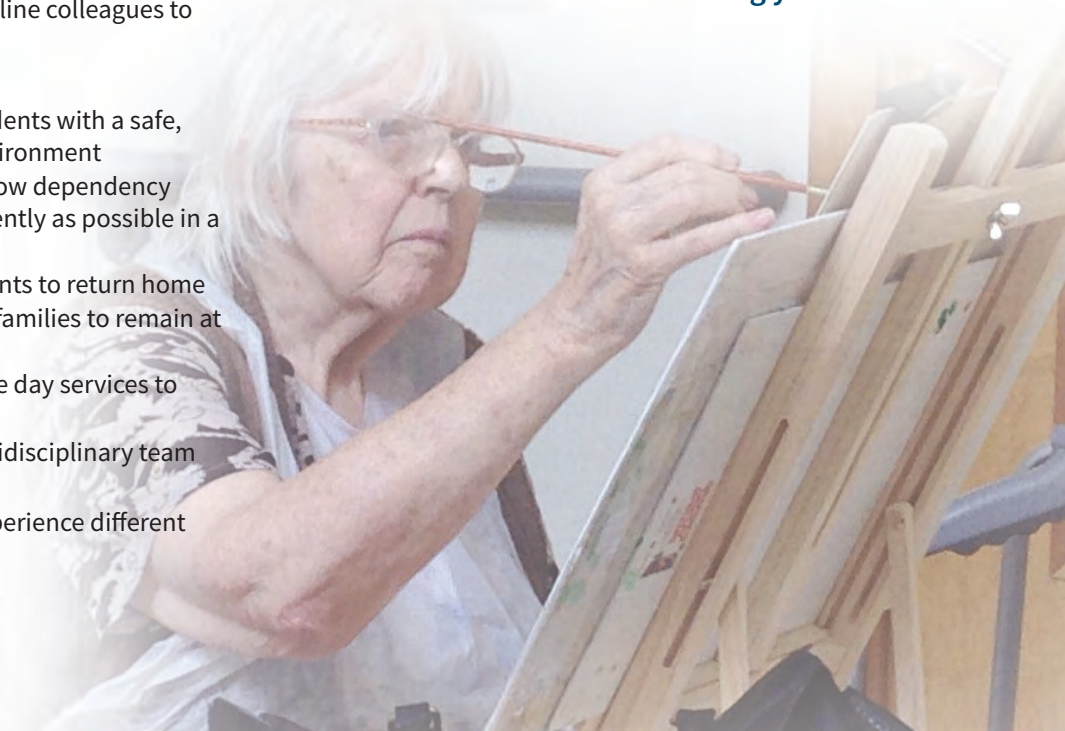
LPH services include:
